North Ayrshire Council want to continue funding them but it is not in writing yet.</p> <p>Bruce is intending to go and do the jobs required in his own time</p>	
<p>Bypass Art</p>	<p>Bypass Art 2017 have developed and supported the following projects:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - pavers at the Post Office - Board at the Cross - Park Board - Films which have recorded the memories of Dalry residents - school workshop about Bessie Dunlop - Memory plaques at Rosearden. - 5 Dalry Heritage Trails - Community recital of John Hodgarts Hilltap Toon <p>A meeting is planned on the 5th of July to finalise details for the siting of a boulder at Rosearden Garden</p> <p>Work is in progress to design a booklet which will contain the 5 Bypass Art Heritage Trails included within the placethatwewknow website and app. Although the trails appear on a website/ app there is no physical evidence within the town that those trails exist- hence the need for a booklet. the booklet will be partially funded by Garnock Connections.</p> <p>Initially the design was to be done by Wades printers but Garnock Connections indicated that they would prefer to complete the design. After a lengthy period with no design forethcoming, Garnock Connections authorised Bypass Art to commence work on the booklet design/ print with the aforementioned local printer.</p> <p>Would be good if the Garnock Valley Connections could support local information booklets/ sign posts/ physical information QR codes etc, rather than individual towns doing it on their own</p>	



	<p>Next project is the 'Gabby Corner'. They are looking at an 'unveiling' event of a mural to recreate the scene of men chatting. The design work for the mural at the 'Old Mens Shelter' scheduled to start around October.</p> <p>Bessie Dunlop audio book in collaboration with John Hodgart and the Grey Hill due to commence production at the end of August.</p> <p>Discussion about submitting an expression of interest to the Community investment Fund (CIF). This submission would be for a feasibility study as regards siting a piece of public art on the Hillend Roundabout. Meeting to be arranged with Christina Pieraccini</p>	
<p>Community Garden</p>	<p>The garden continues to develop</p> <p>The 'Art in the garden' exhibition was a great day and well attended.</p> <p>Tai Chi every Wednesday from 10-11 for 6 weeks</p> <p>Sensory Garden coming along well</p> <p>Afternoon Tea for Breast Cancer being organised for August</p> <p>Neighbourhood Networks continue to come along to the garden</p> <p>Dalry Primary Eco Group now have a vegetable patch with shallots, leeks and potatoes</p> <p>Sheena is liaising with Gareth Wilson regarding the rent for the garden</p> <p>Funding is available from North Ayrshire Council if we put our signs in Gaelic as well as English. This will be put up by the garage regarding the mural and the garden.</p> <p>In Martis workshop area there is a triangular sign which we have asked for to be put at the garage</p>	



	<p>in Smith Street to plant up and advertise the garden.</p> <p>We are looking at solar panels to provide light and heating in the garden room. Janets husband Tony has large panels at home to test them. Lisa will ask what panels the alpaca farmer uses for his electric fence</p> <p>Design for the mural is now completed . This was funded through the Town regeneration monies. The Artists hope to have the Mural completed by July/ August 2022</p>	
Dalry Run 'Skirt the Skeith'	<p>All ready for the run on Sunday 26th of June. Over 80 runners have applied so far and numbers rising.</p> <p>Local people have kindly given their time to Marshall and help out at the event.
